What is your original hometown?

I grew up here in Rochester, New York.

How long have you been an Associate?

I have been an B-8 Associate for about five years.

What/who inspired you to get into the golf industry?

When I was in college, I started working during the summers at a golf course and was able to play a lot, work in the shop, and help teach camps and clinics. After I graduated from college, I joined the PGA program and began working at Brook-Lea.

Are there any fun programs you have initiated for the golfers at your Country Club?

I run weekly Junior clinics in the spring as well as a summer camp. I also help instruct what we call the "futures league." format. This helps to encourage those new golfers to enjoy and pursue the game.

How long have you been in the section and have you had any other jobs?

This was my 5th year working at Brook-Lea and my 5th year in the section. I did not have any other Assistant Pro jobs before this but I worked at a course in Pennsylvania during college.

Have you won any section awards?

This year I was nominated for Assistant Professional of the Year

What are some of your main goals, playing and professional?

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My main goal is to be a head professional at a golf course. I have a passion for golf and helping others to enjoy the game more and more. I hope that wherever I end up I have the opportunity to do all the things that I love, teaching, organizing and running tournaments, and of course, playing golf.

What's in the Bag? Featuring Matt Stasiak Battistoni Golf

Driver: I am playing the TaylorMade SIM Max. I use a 9° head turned down to 8.25° to promote a lower launch, lower spin, and cut bias. This year I switched the Graphite Design Tour AD XC-7 X-Stiff shaft. I play a relatively long driver shaft at 45.75″ which maximizes club head speed and ball speed but have seen an increase in driving accuracy since making the switch to this shaft.



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Fairway: I am playing the TaylorMade SIM Max 15° three wood. I currently have

the UST Mamiya LIN-Q Purple Stiff shaft. This shaft helps promote a slightly higher ball flight with a little more spin which I like for tee shots that require a little more accuracy and precision. My 3 wood length is slightly longer than average at 44" but have seen an increase in accuracy and control since making the change to this shaft/head combination this year.

Driving Iron: I just recently made the switch the new TaylorMade driving iron. I am currently playing the TaylorMade SIM Utility Driving Iron with 19° of loft. TaylorMade has made some great adjustments from the original UDI and I now have a club I can comfortably hit 240+ yards on tight driving holes. I use the Diamana 90 gram hybrid shaft. **Irons:** Last year I made the switch to the TaylorMade P760 irons. I spent a lot of time in the spring of 2019 testing different shafts before deciding on the Nippon N.S. Pro Modus Tour 130 gram extra shift shafts. I play my irons at a half inch long and 2 degrees flat. Since making the switch to these irons, I have seen a huge improvement in distance control and being able to control my trajectory and spin on approach shots.

Wedges: I like to have as many wedges as I can in my bag. My pitching wedge is the TaylorMade P760 at 47°. My gap wedge is the TaylorMade Hi-Toe 52°, bent one degree strong to 51°. Finally, my sand wedge and lob wedge are the TaylorMade MG2 wedges at 56° and 60°. I prefer to carry four wedges so that I have as many options as possible with approach shots into greens and chips/pitches when I am greenside.

Putter: 15 years ago I bought a Scotty Cameron Newport 2 35" putter and I have never been able to find something that performs better. I have a lot of good memories with that putter and always play my best golf when it is in the bag. I like to practice and occasionally play with a mallet putter to help groove my stroke. But when it is time to compete, the Newport 2 is in the bag.

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Ball: I play the TaylorMade TP5 Pix golf ball. Last year, I made the switch to the TaylorMade TP5 and could not be happier with the performance. I had played the same ball for 15+ years and when I finally made the switch, I immediately saw an increase in distance with full swings. In addition to improved distance, I have seen significantly better distance control and spin control with my irons, wedges and greenside shots. This year I have been playing the TP5 Pix which has given me more confidence around the greens and with my putting.

Gloves: My glove of choice is the TaylorMade Tour Preferred glove. I am very picky when it comes to what glove I use and these gloves last forever and have great feel.

I am looking forward to playing in the Assistant Championship in Port St. Lucie in a few weeks. Even though I have not played as much as I would have liked to this summer due to some back issues, I am feeling very confident that I can go down and compete with some great players this year. There is no better feeling than competing and I can not wait to get down there and see how I stack up. Looking forward to seeing everyone in 2021!

THE JUNIOR GOLF PROGRAM NOBODY SAW HAPPENING

In the Fall of 2019, I sat down to read excerpts and highlights of the <u>Ralph Wilson Foundation Study on Youth Sports</u>. Chock full of wonderful information, the two takeaways from this document were kids were not having fun and parents could not afford sports.

As a PGA Professional, growing the game of golf through youth programs has always been of large importance to me. One main reason I enjoy my current facility as much as I do is that Junior Golf has always been promoted. We have always had 30-50 kids in a junior program. The program features eight lessons and eight play opportunities, with varying hole divisions such as 3 or 9 or 18. As I would conduct programs, something seemed to be missing. After I read the aforementioned report, I realized two things: There was way too much money being charged for admission to the program, and kids were not having fun. In short, Ralph Wilson's people explained my problem, I was missing the mark on two fronts: financial and fun.

As we progressed into 2020, I decided to react to both issues. First, I reduced the average cost of the program (member vs. non-member) by roughly 50%, reducing the cost for the same program to \$100.00 per participant. Second, adopted the American Development Model (ADM) to my teaching of the program. PGA Coach is the PGA of America's version of the American Development Model. With this program I created lesson plans, goals, fitness, health, cross sport training and FUN into my lesson plans. We had tennis balls, hula hoops, cones, volleyballs, agility ladders, and of course golf balls and golf clubs.

After controlling what I could, I was still confronted with growing a program threatened by money. Yes, the program was reduced in price, but it was not enough. I needed to lower the financial hurdle, so I set about finding a white knight. I needed to find a sponsor that allowed me to lower the price to \$35.00 per student. I had a conversation with one person who asked me to "let my imagination run away with me. How many kids?" My answer was 100, which would be a donation of \$6,500.00. That same person said "We are in for \$10,000.00." Once that special benefactor was secured (he/she will be forever anonymous) I needed to have equipment for the kids to use. Enter special benefactor number two. An anonymous member of Shorewood Country Club allowed me to purchase 17 sets of US Kids golf clubs for the program. The membership supported us through the donation of "experienced" golf balls, gave up the golf course on play days, and offered support and motivation that spurred the program to excellence.

Now the advertising. As I went into the community with my super affordable, well equipped program in tow, I was confronted with one major hurdle: Covid-19. I treated the pandemic as an opportunity. Youth sports had been suspended, schools were closed, Youth Organizations were not opening on time, so the opportunity to have kids participate in a safe environment was great. Within four weeks of the program being unveiled at the new price and provided equipment, I had 152 kids signed up. Please read that again, 152 kids. At that point, my imagination had officially run away from all of us.

I went about creating a reliable communication network, and divided the kids into 16 person instruction groups, play day tee times and PGA Coach Lesson plans. On the instruction days, I would teach from 8 AM to 7 PM, 8 different days. The curriculum was created on the PGA Coach App and delivered by me. On play days, we averaged 120 "STARTS" per play day, all players utilizing lesson information to improve scores, and parents welcomed to walk with the group that contained their child.

In summary, <u>PGA Coach</u> was my instructional road map. Benefactors eliminated the economic hurdles and committed to something fun. My program boasted 88 hours of instruction, 960 rounds of golf, one incident of crying (from a child), families being on a golf course who had never set foot on one before, 19 new memberships and countless smiles created, candy bars eaten and soft drinks consumed.

The program had over \$15,000 in donations, nearly a 1,000 rounds of golf, 5,280 minutes of instruction, and an incredible amount of fun. I said the word fun, the kids said the word fun, the parents said the word fun, more than any golf or instruction or any other word. I realize the scope of this program is daunting, but I encourage all PGA Professionals to try to expand your program. You will prove yourself invaluable to your facility, do your part in growing the game, become a hallmark of the community and, ultimately, become a better PGA Professional. In addition, maybe you will discover a Junior Golf Program Nobody Saw Happening.

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


College Signing Period

PGA Financial Assistance Fund Scholarship 2020

The PGA Financial Assistance Fund Scholarship application will be available on **December 1, 2020.** It is open to the children and/or grandchildren of PGA Class A Members or Life Members in good standing. The student must have a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.4 (unweighted GPA based on a 4.0 scale). The scholarship will apply to the 2021-2022 school year.

The online scholarship application is managed by International Scholarship & Tuition Services (ISTS). The application will be accessible through <u>PGA.org</u> and accessible by going directly to the application site. The students who applied last year will go to the login page and login with the information they used last year. The username is their email address. The password is what they created.

A student who is applying for the first time will have to create an account to access the application. After creating the account, they will be asked for a Program Key. The program key is: PGA
